Key Achievements of the National Centre for Human Rights for the Year 2024

The Twenty-First Annual Report on the State of Human Rights

This report on the achievements of the National Centre for Human Rights for the year 2024 presents the tasks discharged by the Centre's commissions and monitoring directorates — comprising legislation, policies and practices — pursuant to the powers vested in the Centre by virtue of the National Centre for Human Rights Act No. (51) of 2006 and its amendments, during the year 2024. These tasks and activities constitute the principal source and the cornerstone upon which the substance of the Twenty-First Annual Report for the year 2024 was built.

The Protection Commission

The Protection Commission is composed of the following directorates: the Directorate of Groups Most in Need of Protection; the Directorate of Economic and Social Rights; the Directorate of Civil and Political Rights; and the Directorate of International Mechanisms.

Monitoring Axis

Monitoring the conditions of the groups most in need of protection

1. Women

- Monitoring the conditions of women and child workers on the farms of Mafraq Governorate (Sabha, Al-Dafyaneh, Zamlat Al-Amir Ghazi).
- Monitoring the conditions of women workers in the plant agriculture sector (three farms in the Middle Jordan Valley / Balqa Governorate; three farms in the Northern Jordan Valley / Irbid; and two farms in the Southern Jordan Valley / Karak Governorate).
- Monitoring the right of women to economic empowerment through the implementation of income-generating projects in the Northern Jordan Valley.
- Monitoring six of the agricultural workshops of Sahab in the Capital Governorate.
- Monitoring the conditions of workers in the citrus cultivation sector in the Northern Jordan Valley District, through a monitoring visit to the Jordanian Citrus Agricultural Cooperative Society and the Directorate of Agriculture of the Northern Jordan Valley.
- Monitoring the Family Reconciliation Home in Aqaba.
- Monitoring the conditions of women at risk at the shelter and rehabilitation home for women “Amneh” in Amman.
- Monitoring Karama Home for Victims of Trafficking in Persons / Amman.
- Monitoring the mock elections at Madaba Secondary School for Girls.

2. The Child

- Monitoring the conditions of children's rights at SOS Children's Villages Jordan in the Capital and Aqaba Governorates.
- Monitoring the right of children to play in eight parks in the Capital, Irbid and Karak Governorates.
- Monitoring the centres for the care and rehabilitation of beggars in Madaba, Zarqa and Amman, and the Anti-Begging Directorate.
- Monitoring the juvenile custody facilities in Ma'an, Aqaba and the Capital Governorates.
- Monitoring the Behaviour Modification and Child Rehabilitation Centre in Zarqa.

3. Persons with Disabilities

- Monitoring the conditions of the rights of persons with disabilities at the Rehabilitation and Employment Centre for Persons with Disabilities in Irbid Governorate.
- Monitoring Aya Ghabi Park and the extent of its adaptation for children with disabilities in the Capital Governorate.
- Monitoring the conditions of persons with disabilities at the Aqaba Comprehensive Centre for Special Education in Aqaba.
- Monitoring the right of persons with disabilities to mobility in the Governorates of Ma'an, Jerash, Aqaba and the Capital.
- Monitoring the right of persons with disabilities to mobility through a monitoring visit to the Land Transport Regulatory Commission in the Capital and Aqaba, and to the Jordanian Ministry of Transport.
- Monitoring six polling centres in the Governorates of (the Capital, Jerash, Irbid and Madaba) announced by the Independent Election Commission as having been adapted for persons with disabilities.
- Monitoring the Saudi Centre for the Training and Rehabilitation of Blind Women in Amman.
- Monitoring Abdullah bin Maktoum School for the Blind in Amman.
- Monitoring the Centre for the Care and Rehabilitation of Persons with Disabilities in Dhulail.
- Monitoring the extent of the availability of facilitative arrangements for persons with disabilities in the Northern Shouneh Municipality, the Greater Karak Municipality and Baq'a Camp.
- Monitoring the extent of the provision of reasonable accommodation, accessible formats and accessibility in governmental (service) institutions, through field monitoring visits to:
 - Al-Hussein Cultural Centre of the Greater Amman Municipality in the Ras Al-Ain area.
 - The building of the Greater Amman Municipality in the Ras Al-Ain area.
 - The building of the Medical and Insurance Committees / Social Security Corporation, in the Jabal Al-Hussein area.
 - The building of the Directorate of Examinations and Tests / Ministry of Education, in the Weibdeh area.
 - The building of the Directorate of Health of Persons with Disabilities and Mental Health / Ministry of Health, in the Jabal Al-Hussein area.

4. Older Persons

- Monitoring the Princess Mona Centre for Older Women in Zarqa Governorate.
- Monitoring, twice a year, Al-Zahraa Home for Older Persons in Amman.
- Monitoring Al-Amal Centre for Older Persons in Amman.

- Monitoring the Pioneers' Forum for Older Persons / Day Club.

The most prominent impact achieved on the basis of the Centre's recommendations and the field monitoring visits relating to the groups most in need of protection

The Centre monitored the shelter and rehabilitation home for women (Amneh)⁴⁴⁵ on 16/4/2024⁴⁴⁶. The Centre observed that the Ministry of Social Development, the Ministry of Health and the entities concerned had implemented certain of the recommendations of the Centre contained in its previous annual reports and specialised reports, namely: (a) the fitting out of a flat within the building of the home so as to be fully usable by beneficiaries with disabilities⁴⁴⁷; (b) the building of the capacities of the staff of the home in the rights of persons with disabilities and in case management; (c) the equipping of the sports hall with modern sports apparatus and equipment, and the assignment to every beneficiary of a suitable nutritional regime; (d) the fitting out of a hall for the display of products made by the beneficiaries⁴⁴⁸; (e) the provision to the home of a female physician by the Ministry of Health for at least two days a week⁴⁴⁹; (f) the provision to the home of a four-dimensional ultrasound device for following up the health condition of pregnant beneficiaries during the period of their residence at the home⁴⁵⁰.

The Centre monitored the Family Reconciliation Home in Aqaba on 29/4/2024. The team observed the implementation of the Centre's recommendations, which had been transmitted to the Ministry of Social Development during previous visits, including the following: (a) the existence of a designated shaded area in the garden for the play of the beneficiaries' children, protecting them from the summer heat and equipped with all the requisite facilities; (b) the adaptation of the home for beneficiaries with disabilities; (c) the intensification of the programmes directed at beneficiaries with a view to their economic empowerment, such as courses on electronic marketing, mosaic work, drawing, handicrafts, and soap and candle manufacture, among others; (d) work on raising awareness of the importance of the existence of the home for women victims of violence, and highlighting the services provided to them, through a segment within a radio programme broadcast on Aqaba FM.

The Centre likewise monitored the implementation of the community homes project at the Children's Villages, which provides for the integration of children with their peers, and the villages' response to the recommendation of the National Centre providing for (the retention of girls under the care of the substitute mother, so as to safeguard their psychological well-being and avoid their transfer to the young women's home), and the reduction of the number of children in a single community home to four children, so as to enable the substitute mother to provide them with optimal care and to meet all their living and educational needs and other requirements.⁴⁵¹

As regards the rights of older persons, the National Centre for Human Rights submitted a set of recommendations to the Ministry of Social Development in the light of monitoring visits carried out to a

number of residential homes for older persons⁴⁵², which are conducive to the protection and promotion of the rights of older persons in the Kingdom, namely:

- Working towards the adoption of a temporary care regulation for persons of no fixed abode, given the need to provide care for every person who has taken the street or public places as a refuge and who is without family support, within the age brackets of (18–60) years for males and (18–55) years for females.
- Working towards the activation of the account of the Fund for the Care of Older Persons, and towards the provision of home care as provided for in the Instructions on Benefit and Expenditure for Older Persons from the Older Persons Care Account of 2022.
- Establishing awareness-raising and guidance programmes on the rights of older persons.
- Making it obligatory for the relatives of an older person to visit him or her periodically in residential care homes.
- Establishing governmental day clubs for older persons.

The reply of the Ministry of Social Development⁴⁵³ to the aforementioned letter of the Centre was as follows:

- The issuance of the Regulation on the Licensing of Homes for the Care of Older Persons and Day Clubs Dedicated to Them No. (98) of 2024.
- The Regulation on the Care of Older Persons No. (97) of 2021 was issued, together with the Instructions on Benefit and Expenditure for Older Persons from the Older Persons Care Account of 2022, which determined the provisions and conditions of benefit from the account and the heads of expenditure therefrom. The Fund is presently supplied with (10%) of the proceeds of the lottery pursuant to the provisions of Article (6/a/3) of the Jordanian Charitable Lottery Regulation and its amendments No. (161) of 2019.
- Work is being undertaken with partner entities on the development of the Jordanian National Strategy for Older Persons, which was first launched in 2012 and is developed every (4 years), and which aims at a society that protects older persons and their rights, that recognises their experience and capacities, and that provides them with a decent life and a supportive environment mindful of their particular circumstances, through the coordination of the efforts of all governmental and non-governmental entities so as to ensure their effective participation in society. There are six entry points constituting the priorities of the issues of older persons and ageing in Jordan, namely:
 - 1 - Social protection and financial security.
 - 2 - Health care for older persons.
 - 3 - Social care.
 - 4 - Participation and the promotion of intergenerational solidarity.
 - 5 - The protection of older persons from violence and neglect, and in times of crisis.
 - 6 - An enabling environment supportive of older persons.
- Most of the cases placed in homes for the care of older persons are persons without family support or persons abandoned by their relatives. The relatives of older persons are encouraged to visit them within the home, but there is nothing that empowers the authorities to compel them to do so.
- There is a single day club in the Capital, Amman, three out of four day clubs having been closed during the period (2018–2022) owing to their inability to cover their operating costs, in consequence of their not having received the requisite support. Work is, however, presently under way on the licensing of

a second day club in the Wadi Al-Haddadeh area, which is in process; the Darat Samir Shamma Association is likewise now moving towards the reopening of the day club located at the Darat.

Economic, Social and Cultural Rights

1. The right to health: (23) monitoring visits were carried out to hospitals and to comprehensive, primary and subsidiary health centres, in addition to the monitoring of the reality of the right to health, as follows:

4. The right to a sound environment

- Conducting a field visit to the environment of the Industrial Estates City / Capital Governorate, Sahab Industrial City.
- Conducting a monitoring visit to the quarry sites / Ajloun Governorate.

The most prominent impact achieved on the basis of the Centre's recommendations and the field monitoring visits relating to economic, social and cultural rights

Within the framework of the follow-up of the observations and recommendations concerning the reality of basic and secondary schools — in terms of the level of services and care available therein, and the extent of their readiness to fulfil the intended educational mission — which were monitored by the National Centre⁴⁵⁴, (17) official communications were addressed to the Ministry of Education setting out the outputs of the monitoring visits carried out during the year 2024 to a number of basic and secondary schools in the governorates of the Southern Region (Aqaba Governorate) and the governorates of the Central Region

(Madaba Governorate and Zarqa Governorate). The Ministry of Education took the requisite measures within the human and material resources available to it, with a view to raising the level of educational services and the care available therein⁴⁵⁵.

Within the framework of the follow-up of the observations and recommendations concerning the reality of hospitals and comprehensive and primary health centres — in terms of the health, curative and preventive services provided to citizens, and with a view to examining the improvement measures led by the Ministry of Health in the hospitals and comprehensive and primary health centres monitored by the National Centre — (23) official communications were addressed to the Ministry of Health setting out the outputs of the monitoring visits carried out during the year 2024 to a number of hospitals and comprehensive, primary and subsidiary health centres in the governorates of the Southern Region (Aqaba Governorate) and the governorates of the Central Region (Madaba Governorate and Zarqa Governorate). A reply was received from the Ministry of Health to the National Centre's communications, which set out the Ministry's adoption of a set of measures within the human and material resources available to it, with a view to raising the level of the health, curative and preventive services provided to citizens, the most prominent of which are the following:

1. The contract of the paediatric consultant was renewed, so as to ensure that one of the hospitals of the South is not left without its sole paediatric consultant.
2. The Minister of Health instructed those concerned to form a committee to take up the recommendations and observations contained in the letters of the National Centre and to take the requisite action.

In the same context, two communications were addressed to the Greater Amman Municipality concerning medical waste and the mechanism of its disposal — as regards the mechanism of disposing of domestic medical waste emanating from the facilities of the Ministry of Health, and the mechanism of disposing of (treated) medical waste at certain hospitals so that it becomes non-infectious domestic waste. A reply was received to the effect that, as regards increasing the number of containers for health facilities and the necessity of transporting medical waste on a periodic basis, the entity concerned (the owner of the medical facility) is responsible for securing a sufficient number of medical containers and for transporting the waste periodically through private companies.

A communication was likewise addressed to the Higher Council for the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, setting out the National Centre's observation as to the need of the medical and nursing cadres working in hospitals and health centres for training courses concerning the mechanism of dealing with persons with disabilities of all descriptions. A reply was received from the Higher Council for the Rights of Persons with Disabilities to the National Centre's communication, to the effect that during the year 2024 the Higher Council had assessed certain hospitals and health centres as to the extent of the availability of accessibility therein, and had provided the medical and nursing cadres working in certain hospitals and health centres with training relating to the human rights-based approach, effective communication etiquette with persons with disabilities, and their access to health services; in addition to which the Higher Council has projects to be implemented during the year 2025 for the assessment and study of the extent of the adaptation of (60) health centres and (8) hospitals, through the Accessibility Directorate of the Council. Accordingly, work will be undertaken on coordinating efforts and establishing a mechanism of joint cooperation between the National Centre, the Higher Council and the Ministry of Health⁴⁵⁶, so as to contribute to the promotion of the rights of persons with disabilities and older persons in society. To this end, a consultative meeting was held by the Centre with the Higher Council for the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, and agreement was reached on a set of measures for the purpose of promoting the rights of persons with disabilities in gaining access to the right to health.

Within the framework of the follow-up of the observations and recommendations concerning the reality of workers and the extent of their enjoyment of their labour rights, in addition to the extent of the provision of a suitable working environment for them, as monitored by the National Centre, (5) official communications were addressed to the Ministry of Labour setting out the outputs of the monitoring visits carried out during the year 2024 to the qualified industrial zones. In this context, the Ministry of Labour indicated its readiness to carry out inspection rounds by the cadres of labour inspectors together with the team of the National Centre, in order to examine the actual state of the factories. A set of measures was taken by the Ministry of Labour in implementation of the Centre's recommendations, as set out in detail in the body of the report (the axis on the right to work).

As regards the right to a sound environment, it should be noted that, within the framework of the follow-up of the Centre's observations based on the outputs of its monitoring visits to Dhulail Industrial Area in Zarqa Governorate, the Centre addressed the Ministry of Water and Irrigation and the Ministry of Environment, and received certain replies, including: that the Ministry of Water and Irrigation had addressed the Ministry of Planning and International Cooperation with a view to securing the financial allocations necessary for updating the earlier studies and for implementing the sewerage network project, and that a start would be made on updating the technical studies and preparing the requisite tender documents and implementing the project as soon as the financial allocations therefor became available, in accordance with due process⁴⁵⁷.

Within the framework of the follow-up of the Centre's recommendations relating to the outcome of the monitoring visits to the site of the Pepsi pond in the Russeifa area, the Centre addressed the Ministry of Environment, the Ministry of Local Administration and the Greater Amman Municipality, and received certain replies, including that the Ministry of Environment had addressed the Ministry of Agriculture, the Ministry of Local Administration and the Greater Amman Municipality, instructing those concerned to take the requisite action, each according to its competence.

Civil and Political Rights

- Monitoring manifestations of peaceful assembly, comprising forty (40) events, solidarity vigils and others.
- The Centre carried out (92) visits to correction and rehabilitation centres during the year 2024, in the course of which (111) inmates were interviewed, as follows: (65) inmates were interviewed on the basis of complaints received by the Centre, and (46) inmates were interviewed on the basis of monitoring.
- Following up detainees held against the background of certain sit-ins or protest vigils, conducting field visits to them, and addressing the entities concerned.
- The Centre received (709) complaints during the year 2024; these were acted upon within the relevant procedures, and the entities concerned were addressed.
- The Centre received (563) replies to the communications addressed to the entities concerned for the follow-up of complaints.

Third: Annual, Specialised and Monitoring Reports, and the Reports Submitted to the Treaty Bodies

- Preparing a specialised report on the recommendations and outputs relating to the legislative impact of the Cybercrime Act.
- Preparing the report on the parliamentary elections for the Twentieth House of Representatives of the year 2024.

- Preparing and discussing the shadow report on the Convention against Torture before the Committee against Torture in Geneva, October 2024.
- Preparing and discussing the shadow report relating to the Universal Periodic Review mechanism.
- Participating in the preparation of the official Beijing report with the Jordanian National Commission for Women.
- A statement submitted to the Human Rights Committee established under the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, concerning the concluding recommendations addressed to Jordan under that Covenant.
- Preparing the first draft of the shadow report on the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW).

Fourth: Embedding Human Rights Concepts in School Curricula

Within the framework of the Centre's mandate to embed human rights concepts in educational curricula, the Centre worked as follows:

- Reviewing twelve curricula prepared by the National Centre for Curriculum Development, for the purpose of embedding human rights concepts and principles therein. These covered the following subjects: Arabic language, social studies, Islamic education, history, national and civic education, geography, Islamic studies and Islamic education, in respect of the following grades (the first, fourth, seventh, ninth, tenth, twelfth / literary stream, and the twelfth grade / all streams).
- Attending focused working groups for the purpose of reviewing the curricula at the National Centre for Curriculum Development.
- Presenting best practices concerning the Centre's experience in embedding human rights concepts in curricula, to the Arab Human Rights Network.

Fifth: Seminars and Discussion Sessions Held

- A discussion session on the food industries in Jordan.
